

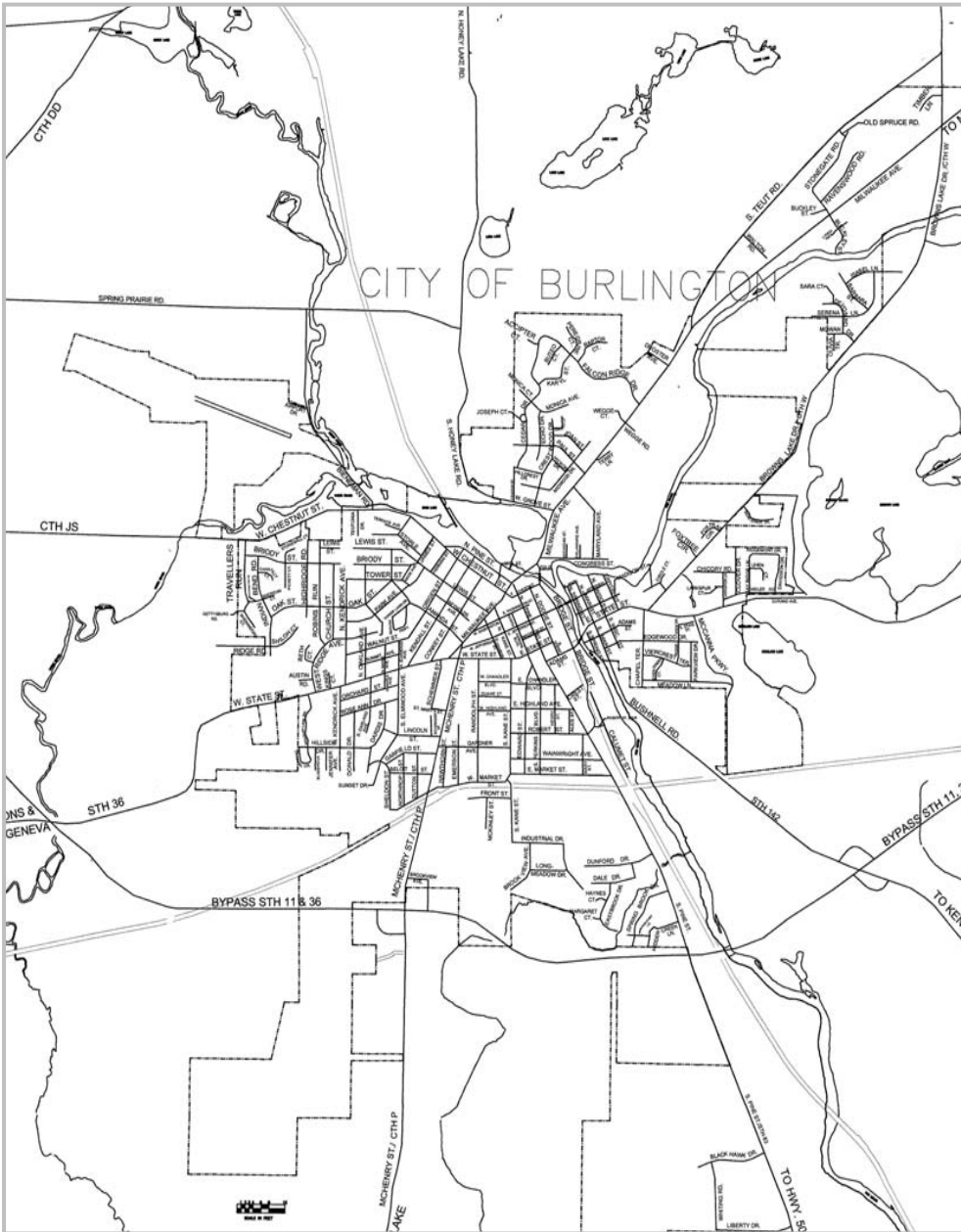

SENIOR CENTER

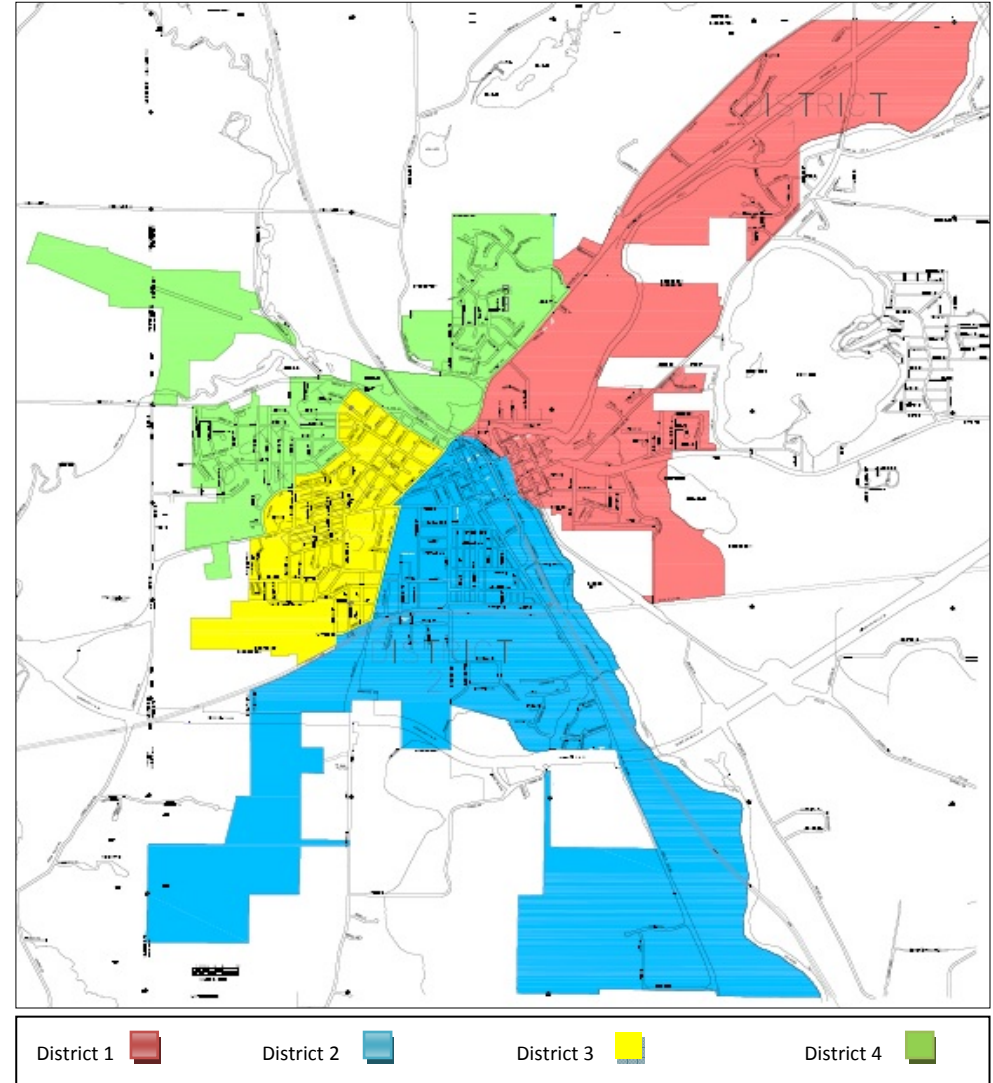

SNOW REMOVAL

Municipal Code requires that public sidewalks and adjoining crosswalks are clear of snow and ice within 18 hours after snow has ceased to fall or accumulate. Failure to comply authorizes the City to have such work performed and bill the property owner for this service.

WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS

When 3" or more of snow accumulates in a 24 hour period winter parking restrictions will go into effect. Parking is prohibited from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. on any street, alley or municipal parking lot. This parking regulation is in effect for 48 hours or until snowplowing operations are declared, completed by the Public Works Department.

AIRPORT COMMITTEE-6:00p.m., 4th Thurs. Municipal Airport

The Committee recommends regulations, airport development and land uses, and fees and/or charges for the use of the airport to the Common Council and shall administer the same as finally adopted by the Council. The Committee also recommends an Airport Manager whose employment and compensation shall be reviewed and approved by the Council. The Committee prepares and adopts standard leases and agreements for the various types of airport activities and land uses authorized in this section and adopt regulations and establish fees or charges for the use of airport property during goose hunting season for goose hunting. In the event the Airport Committee determines that the goose population has reached a point on the airport property where it has become a safety hazard, the Airport Committee has the authority to allow hunting and the discharge of firearms under Chapter 308, §308-1 of this Municipal Code at times other than hunting season as in its discretion is necessary to promote the safe use of the airport.

A Community Development Authority (CDA) is created for the purpose of carrying out blight elimination, slum clearance, and urban renewal programs. The CDA is an independent public body exercising public powers to protect and promote the health, safety and morals of city residents. The powers of the Community Development Authority are to prepare redevelopment and urban renewal plans and carry out redevelopment and urban renewal projects within the city, enter into contracts for the purpose of redevelopment and urban renewal, acquire by purchase, lease, eminent domain, or otherwise, any real or personal property necessary or incidental to a redevelopment or urban renewal project, and borrow money and issue bonds; apply for and accept loans, grants and contributions for the purpose of redevelopment and urban renewal.

The Library Board has the powers and duties set forth in § 43.58, Wis. Stats., including exclusive control of the expenditure of all monies collected, donated or appropriated for the library fund and exclusive charge, control and custody of all lands, buildings, money or other property devised, bequeathed, given or granted to, or otherwise acquired or leased by, the City of Burlington for library purposes. The Library Board may contract with library organizations to provide or receive library services as set forth in § 43.52, Wis. Stats. The Library Board shall supervise the administration of the Burlington Public Library and shall appoint a Librarian, who shall appoint such other assistants and employees as the Board deems necessary and prescribe their duties and compensation.

PARK BOARD – 6:30 p.m., 3rd Thursday Public Works Facility

The Park Board is responsible for management, control, improvement and care for all public parks and parkways within the city, and for the suitable use and enjoyment of the parks. The Park Board has established rules and regulations to promote these purposes. The Park Board is also responsible for acquiring, in the name of the city, property of funds for park purposes.
